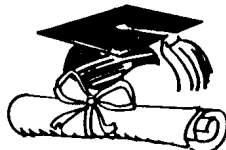
Annunciation Maternity Home Banquet

Do you know...why the Church teaches that the Pope is infallible in his teachings when he is a human being, with a finite human intellect, like the rest of us? The doctrine of Papal Infallibility does not mean the Pope is always right in all his personal teachings. Catholics are quite aware that, despite his great learning, the Pope is very much a human being and therefore liable to commit human error. On some subjects, like sports and manufacturing, his judgment is liable to be very faulty. The doctrine simply means that the Pope is divinely protected from error when, acting in his official capacity as chief shepherd of the Catholic fold, he promulgates (publicizes) a decision which is binding on the conscience of all Catholics throughout the world. In other words, his infallibility is limited to his specialty--the Faith of Jesus Christ.

In order for the Pope to be infallible on a particular statement, four conditions must apply: 1) he must be speaking *ex cathedra* . . . that is, "from the Chair" of Peter, or in other words, officially, as head of the entire Church; 2) the decision must be for the whole Church; 3) it must be on a matter of faith or morals; 4) the Pope must have the intention of making a final decision on a teaching of faith or morals, so that it is to be held by all the faithful. It must be interpretive, not originative; the Pope has no authority to originate new doctrine. He is not the author of revelation--only its guardian and expounder. He has no power to distort a single word of Scripture, or change one piece of divine tradition.

His infallibility is limited strictly to the province of doctrinal interpretation, and it is used quite rarely. It is used in order to clarify, to "define," some point of the ancient Christian tradition. It is the infallibility of which Christ spoke when He said to Peter, the first Pope: "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. What ever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. (Matt. 16:19). Certainly Christ would not have admonished His followers to "hear the church" (Matt. 18:17) without somehow making certain that what they heard was the truth--without somehow making the teaching magisterium of His Church infallible.

For a complete understanding of the Pope's infallibility, one more thing should be known: His *ex cathedra* decisions are not the result of his own private deliberations. They are the result of many years of consultation with the other bishops and theologians of the Church. He is, in effect, voicing the belief of the whole Church. His infallibility is not his own private endowment, but rather an endowment of the entire Mystical Body of Christ. Indeed, the Pope's hands are tied with regard to the changing of Christian doctrine. No Pope has ever used his infallibility to change, add, or subtract any Christian teaching; this is because Our Lord promised to be with His Church until the end of the world. (Matt. 28:20).

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is scheduled every Friday from 9 am-5:30 pm (5:00 on First Fridays) in the Family Chapel. ***What is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament?*** It has been the consistent belief of the Catholic Church from the very beginning that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharistic Christ continues to be present in our midst beyond the Eucharistic Liturgy when the consecrated host is either reposed in a tabernacle or exposed on the altar. Eucharistic Adoration is the adoration of Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist displayed in a special holder called a monstrance and people come to pray and worship Jesus continually throughout the day. Christ's great love for us was shown when he was crucified on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins and give us eternal life. He loves us without limit, and offers Himself to us in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Please stop by in the Family Chapel on Fridays and spend a few moments with Jesus in the Eucharist...in the silence, you will hear his whisper. *"So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?" Matt. 26:40*

Baptisms: Do you have a child that is under the age of 7 years old who has not been baptized? In the past there has been a lot of misunderstanding in regards to baptisms in the Catholic Church. One of the comments made recently by a member, "I heard that if I am not married in the Catholic Church, then I cannot baptize my child". That is untrue, children of parents who are not married in the Catholic Church or simply not married civilly, can be baptized in the Catholic Church. The parents just have to make sure they understand and accept the responsibility in forming faith in their children. The parents are invited to have their marriage convalidated by the Catholic Church. For the godparents/sponsors, if they are married, it must be through the Catholic Church. Children, on the other hand, who have reached age 7 or older, who are not baptized will need to attend religious education classes, since they are at the Age of Reason; and be baptized and receive First Communion at a date set forth after completing the classes. Another question that has been asked is, "Do I have to be a registered parishioner at St. Joseph's to baptize my child"? If, you live within the region designated by the Austin Diocese (having a Killeen address), then "No" you wouldn't need to be registered as a member. If, however, you live out of the designated region (for example: Harker Heights) then "Yes" you would need to be a registered member, to have the child baptized at St. Joseph's. Everyone is welcome to register; you may pick up a form in the Parish Office or in the Visitor's Center/Breezeway.

Bautizos: Tienes un hijo infantil (de menos de 7 años) sin bautizarse? Hay mucha mal entendimiento sobre quien puede ser bautizado en la iglesia Católica. Una declaración recientemente, "Yo oí que mi hijo no puede ser bautizado porque yo no estoy casada por la iglesia" Esto es falso. Niños, de padres que no están casados en la iglesia o sin ser casados, se pueden bautizar en la Iglesia católica. Los padres lo que tienen que tener es aceptar su responsabilidad de asegurar la formación de fe para sus hijos. Cuando los padres no están casados por la Iglesia, se les invita a convalidar su matrimonio. Sin embargo, los padrinos, si casados, debe ser por la Iglesia Católica.

Niños de más de 7 años o más de edad que no estén bautizados, tienen que ser catequizados antes del bautismo porque ya han llegado a la edad de razón. La otra pregunta: "Tengo que estar inscrito (ser miembro) en la parroquia de San José para poder bautizar"? Si usted vive en los límites designados por la Diócesis de Austin (teniendo una dirección de Killeen) no necesita estar registrado para poder bautizar aquí en San José.

Si usted vive afuera de los límites (en Harker Heights o otro ciudad) entonces si necesita estar inscrito (registrado) como miembro y asistiendo a la misa en San José para poder bautizar a su hijo en San José. Llame a la oficina para más información de Bautizos. A todos se les invita a registrarse, llenando una forma de inscripción cuales puede encontrar en el centro de información.
