Pastor's Corner



About ten years ago, I had the opportunity to tour the Dachau Nazi concentration camp located just outside of Munich, Germany. I discovered on the tour that this particular camp was the place where German physicians conducted medical experiments on primarily Jewish men and women (and even children) that killed many and left others severely disfigured. The purpose of these experiments was to "advance medical science" and find cures for sickness and disease - all at the expense of an innocent human life.

This past week, a third disturbing video surfaced that exposed the unimaginable atrocities Planned Parenthood has conducted on freshly aborted babies in which the doctor spoke candidly about harvesting organs from a human being to be sold for medical research. As I watched this video, I had a flashback to my tour of Dachau and the same feeling of disgust I had then came back to me now. The difference, of course, is that the experiments in Dachau were done under a brutal regime that oppressed many people including their own, while what has been going on at Planned Parenthood is right here in the United States. How can this be? What is even more disturbing is the lack of outcry on the part of the majority of the American people about an atrocity that is on equal footing with what happened at Dachau. Unfortunately, it is somewhat indicative as to where our culture has gone in the area of respecting the dignity of all human life.

As disciples of Jesus, we have not only a moral duty, but also a civic responsibility to speak out against this blatant disregard for human dignity and human life. This requires much prayer, education about what is happening in our culture and world, and especially the moral fortitude to call out evil when we see it. I believe another way (perhaps even a better way) to counter such evil is for each of us to practice ways of promoting the beauty and dignity of all human life, from the moment of conception until the last breath of natural death and all points in between. We also need to find it in our hearts to forgive those who have wronged us and pray for those in prison and on death row. All human life is sacred and if we disregard it in one area, it will impact the way we look at it in another.

Palabras del Pastor

Hace unos diez años, tuve la oportunidad de recorrer el campo de concentración Nazi de Dachau ubicado a las afueras de Munich, Alemania. Durante esta gira descubrí que este campo en particular era el lugar donde médicos alemanes realizaron experimentos médicos en principalmente hombres judíos y las mujeres (y niños incluso) que mataron a muchos y dejaron otros gravemente desfigurados. El propósito de estos experimentos era "avanzar la ciencia médica" y encontrar curas para enfermedades. - todo a expensas de una vida humana inocente.

La semana pasada, un tercer inquietante video que salió y que expuso las atrocidades inimaginables que "Planificación Familiar" ha llevado a cabo en bebés recién abortados en el que el doctor habló francamente sobre cosechar órganos de un ser humano para ser vendidos para investigación médica. Mientras miraba este video, recordé a mi gira en Dachau y el mismo sentimiento de repugnancia que tenía entonces, regresó a mí. La diferencia, por supuesto, es que los experimentos en Dachau se realizaron bajo un régimen brutal que oprimía a muchos incluyendo su propia gente, mientras que lo que ha estado pasando en "Planificación Familiar" está aquí en los Estados Unidos. ¿Cómo puede ser esto? Lo que es aún más preocupante es la falta de protesta por parte de la mayoría de los estadounidenses sobre la atrocidad que está en pie de igualdad con lo que pasó en Dachau. Por desgracia, es algo que indica a donde ha ido nuestra cultura en el área del respeto hacia la dignidad de toda vida humana.

Como discípulos de Jesús, tenemos no sólo un deber moral, sino también una responsabilidad cívica para expresarse en contra de esta descarada indiferencia por la dignidad y vida humana. Esto requiere mucha oración, educación sobre lo que está sucediendo en nuestra cultura y mundo y especialmente la fortaleza moral para denunciar el mal cuando lo vemos. Creo que otra forma (tal vez incluso mejor) para contrarrestar tal mal es que cada uno de nosotros practiquemos formas de promover la belleza y la dignidad de toda vida humana, desde el momento de la concepción hasta el último aliento de muerte natural y todos los puntos intermedios. También tenemos que encontrar en nuestros corazones el perdonar a quienes nos han ofendido y orar por aquellos en prisión y condenados a muerte. Toda vida humana es sagrada y si la ignoramos en una zona, afectará la forma en que miramos otra.
