**Feast of the Assumption**

On August 15th, we recall Our Lady's being assumed into Heaven and crowned Queen.

Though the Church has always believed in the Assumption of Mary, the dogma (doctrine) was only formally defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Note that Mary was assumed into Heaven—

taken up by the power of God—while Christ ascended into Heaven under His own power.

According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the date of Mary's Assumption is placed from anywhere between 3 and 15 years after Our Lord's Ascension, and the place from which she was assumed is listed as Jerusalem near the Garden of Gethsemane.

According to the beliefs of early Christians, Mary's body "fell asleep" at death and rested until awakened in the glory of the next life. Emperor Maricius Falvisu (528-602) decreed that the liturgical feast of Mary's "dormition" be celebrated throughout the Byzantine Empire on August 15<sup>th</sup>. After then, when Mary's dormition was celebrated each year, preachers began to proclaim more clearly her Assumption, as well as her death. Mary's body did not decompose after death and burial, but instead Mary was gloriously assumed intact. According to tradition, Our Lady's tomb was not exactly found empty; lilies and roses were found where her body "should" have been. This Feast is associated with herbs and fruits, and the Roman Ritual includes a blessing for such. It is custom to bring fresh flowers to adorn the Church in Mary's honor, and in some cultures they bring fruit and herbs – especially healing herbs – to be blessed and take home.

**INFANT BAPTISM GUIDELINES****FOR PARENTS AND GODPARENTS**

1. Baptismal class in English is held the first Tuesday of each month at 6:30 PM in the Parish Activity Center. Class is **required** for both parents and godparents. **(The class is valid for 1 year).**
2. Registration must be done for both the class and the baptism at the parish office Monday-Friday, 10:30 AM to 5:00 PM. Please bring the child's birth certificate.
3. Childcare is **not** available during the baptismal class. Please **do not** bring children to the class.
4. Baptisms are celebrated the second Saturday of the month after the 5:30 PM mass.
5. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, who have received all the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, Confirmation and, if married, the marriage must be through the Catholic Church). A Godparent must be at least 16 years old. **Very important:** If the godparents are members of another parish, we need a letter of permission from their Parish before baptism.
6. There is no fee for the sacrament of Baptism.
7. After attending the class, a letter will be provided for verification to another parish at the parish office.
8. If you have any questions or special circumstances, please call the parish office to make an appointment with a priest by calling 254-634-7878.

**REQUISITOS PARA BAUTISMO****PARA LOS PADRES Y PADRINOS DE INFANTES**

1. La clase de Bautizo en Español es el segundo Martes de cada mes a las 6:30 PM en el Centro de Actividades. **Es necesario** que los padres y los padrinos atiendan. **Esta clase es valida por 1 año.**
2. Es requerido que se registre para la clase y el Bautizo en la oficina. Horario de Lunes a Viernes de 10:30 AM a 5:00 PM. Por favor de traer la acta de nacimiento del niño/a.
3. **No hay guardería** durante la clase de bautismo, por favor **no traigan** a sus niños a la clase.
4. Los Bautizos son celebrados el cuarto Sábado del mes después de la misa de las 5:30 PM.
5. Los padrinos deberán ser mayores de 16 años, ser Católicos deberán de ver recibido los sacramentos de Bautismo, Comunión, y Confirmación y si son casados deberán serlo por la Iglesia Católica. **Recuerde:** Si los padrinos son miembros de otra parroquia, deberán de obtener una carta de permiso de la parroquia a la cual pertenecen antes de la fecha del bautizo.
6. No hay costo para el sacramento de Bautizo.
7. Después de atender la clase de bautismo, se les proporcionara un comprobante para las personas que desean bautizar en otra parroquia,
8. Si tienen alguna pregunta o circunstancia especial, por favor de llamar a la oficina para hacer una cita con el sacerdote, llamando al 254-634-7878.

**ETHICS AND INTEGRITY IN MINISTRY** Clergy, religious, paid staff and all volunteers working with minors and/or vulnerable adults at any parish, Catholic school or diocesan location are required to complete an Application for Ministry/background check **and** attend an EIM workshop every three years. Ministry with minors and/or vulnerable adults pertains to any ministry, program or organization that serves youth or vulnerable adults in any manner or which functions at a time and place where minors or vulnerable adults are typically present. A listing of such ministries/programs or organizations includes, **but is not limited to:**

- religious education, youth ministry, Catholic schools, homeschooling organizations that use church property or identify as a parish ministry, homebound/hospital ministry, parish nursery and mother's day out/pre-school programs, liturgical ministries (i.e. hospitality/ushers, extraordinary ministers of holy Communion, lectors, choir/music ministry, etc), St Vincent de Paul Society conferences, parish/school sponsored scout groups and other activities/programs for youth.
- EIM compliance is required for the leadership of parish and diocesan organizations that may serve youth even though their primary function is not necessarily to serve youth (i.e. ladies/men's clubs, Knights of Columbus, Knights of Peter Claver, Serra Club/vocations ministry, etc); for members of such organization the EIM compliance requirement may be waived if participation is limited to times and places when minors are not present.
- Pastors and principals may determine that those in any parish/school leadership position (i.e. ministry and organization leaders and Pastoral, Finance and Stewardship Council members, school advisory board members) should be in compliance with these diocesan EIM policies as a symbol of leadership within the parish/school and support of the policies of the church.
- Pastors and principals may choose to include additional ministries/organizations to this listing at the local level.
